OPINION Paragraph of 4 or 5 sentences.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Your overall opinion of the book * Give specific reasons <u>WHY</u> you <u>liked</u> or <u>didn't like</u> the story. * Rate the book out of 5 stars and explain your rating. * Provide recommendations about who else would like the book. (You can suggest classmates or people with common interests.)
CHARACTER Paragraph of 4 or 5 sentences.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Describe your favorite character. * Include physical and personality traits. * Select 2 or 3 LPA that can be used to describe your favorite character and give specific story details to support your choices. <p><u>Learner Profile Attributes (LPA) include:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Inquirer - Communicator - Reflective - Caring - Balanced - Open-Minded - Principled - Risk-Taker - Thinkers <li style="text-align: center;">- Knowledgeable
CONFLICT Paragraph of 4 or 5 sentences.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Tell about the main problem, mystery, or conflict in the story. * Tell how the problem was resolved (solved). * Explain if you <u>were</u> or <u>weren't</u> satisfied with the resolution. * Describe the most surprising part of the resolution or the conflict in general.
